Garbage & Recycling Collection

- ◆ All homes are required to participate in the garbage and recycling program. Services are billed as a special charge on the annual property tax bill.
- ◆ Garbage and recyclables will be collected each Thursday, with adjustments for holiday weeks. (Please refer to the calendar on the reverse.) Items for collection must be placed curbside by 7:00 a.m. Residents should remove emptied carts from the curb in a timely manner.
- ◆ Wheeled garbage carts are provided by Veolia. Broken wheels or lids, or damage due to normal wear and tear should be reported to the Village Clerk (715-687-4166) for replacement. Carts damaged by negligence will be replaced with a \$75.00 charge to the property owner.
- ◆ **Weekly garbage MUST fit inside your cart.** Garbage bag stickers may be purchased at the Village office (\$1.50 each) for the occasional weeks that you have excess garbage.
- ◆ Recycling crates are available at the Municipal Building at a cost of \$10.00 each. It is suggested that each household use two crates (one for containers, the other for papers) as described under "Recycling Guidelines".
- ◆ Waste oil and oil filters are not collected curbside. Contact Rock Oil (715-687-4198) or a service station to properly recycle these items.
- ◆ Sharps cannot be included with trash. Contact your medical provider for disposal options.

The Wisconsin Department of Natural Resources provides financial assistance to municipalities through grant awards based on the amount of recyclables collected locally each year. In 2010, the Village of

Stratford received a DNR grant of **\$13,660.90** to offset the contracted cost of curbside collection charged to residents.

Spring & Fall Clean Up Days

- ◆ Curbside collection of discarded household items, such as mattresses, carpet, major appliances, furniture, excess garbage, etc.
- ◆ **NO computers, electronics, television, microwaves, waste oil or filters, tires, or construction materials.**

Compost Site

201 Connor Avenue (in the industrial park)

Open MAY through OCTOBER
24 hrs/day 7 days a week

- ◆ "Green" or "brown" biodegradable waste materials should be brought to the compost site and dumped on the appropriate pile.
- ◆ Do not leave bags or trash at the compost site.
- ◆ Compost site is video-monitored for compliance.
- ◆ FREE compost and wood chips are available while supplies last.

Hazardous Waste and Electronics Collection

Saturday, September 24, 2011 8:00 a.m. - 12:00 noon
at the Stratford Area Fire Station, 613 S. Weber Ave.

- ◆ Computer components, televisions and electronics will be collected with a disposal fee charged.
- ◆ Hazardous wastes (paints and thinners, aerosol products, fertilizers, herbicides, old gasoline and oil, etc.) will be disposed of by a Veolia Hazardous Waste Team.

(This a Cooperative Recycling Event with Marathon County Solid Waste Department and area municipalities.)

Yard Waste Collection

- ◆ Curbside collection of leaves, grass clippings and garden materials. Use **clear** plastic bags only.
- ◆ All tree brush and branches **must be bundled**, not larger than 2 feet in diameter by 8 feet in length, and not heavier than 50 pounds per bundle. Keep thorny brush in separate bundles not longer than 3 feet in length.
- ◆ Do not set brush out earlier than 48 hours before yard clean up dates. The property owner is responsible for all terrace clean up.

RECYCLING GUIDELINES



CONTAINERS

ALUMINUM CANS includes used beverage cans.

GLASS CONTAINERS must be clean, with caps removed. Labels and neck rings can remain on glass. Glass should not be broken. **Does not include** dishes, ceramic cups, ovenware, safety and window glass, plate glass, heat-resistant glass such as Pyrex, or lead-based glass such as crystal.

PLASTIC BOTTLES AND CONTAINERS includes plastic bottles and containers marked with the recycling emblem numbered #1 through #7. Caps and covers must be removed. Labels and neck rings can remain on plastic. Empty and rinse all containers. **Does not include** #1 brown plastic bottles, motor oil bottles, #6 Styrofoam containers, CD cases, plastic film, shrink wrap, plastic bags, or vinyl items such as windows or siding.

ASEPTIC CONTAINERS includes cartons or boxes used for juice, milk, soy milk, ice cream, or broths.

TIN CANS includes tin coated metal cans, bi-metal cans and steel containers, which must be clean and labels must be removed. If convenient, please cut out both ends and flatten. Cut out ends are recyclable.



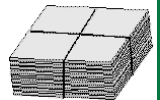

PAPER & FIBER PRODUCTS

MIXED PAPERS includes all grades of papers (white, colored, ledger, shiny, coated, carbonless or NCR paper), envelopes (kraft, windowed, or labeled), magazines, phone books, computer printout paper, glued pads and tablets, file folders, keypunch cards, post-it notes, spiral notebooks, canned soda boxes, cereal boxes, shoe boxes, etc. Prepare for collection in paper grocery bags, boxes, bundled not more than twelve (12) inches high, or securely placed in the recycling crate. Can include paper clips and staples. **Does not include** hand towels or other paper products from restrooms, soiled napkins and paper plates, carbon paper, cellophane, or any waxed paper.

NEWSPAPERS includes newspapers and newspaper advertisements.

CORRUGATED CARDBOARD includes clean corrugated cardboard only. Cardboard must be flattened and bundled in bundles not more than twelve (12) inches high and twenty-four (24) inches wide and thirty-six (36) inches long. **Does not include waxed cardboard.**
